TWO AUDUBON SCREEN TOURS will be presented next Saturday, October 7, in the Montgomery Theatre, San Jose Civic Auditorium. At the matinee, at 2:30 p.m., Mr. Maslowski will show "OUR HERITAGE IN THE ROCKIES," the result of two season's filming in Yellowstone National Park. We are promised a trumpeter swan, antelope, bighorn sheep, moose, beavers, and other wild animals, against a backdrop of spectacular mountain scenery, geysers, and beautiful wild flowers.

At the evening performance, at 8 o'clock, Mr. Maslowski will present "BENEATH BUCKEYE SKIES." In this film the fields, forests, and quiet streams of Ohio, the Buckeye State, provide the background for roles played by "Old Needle-nose" the woodcock, a screech owl, deer mice, tiny but tigerish shrews, an amusing family of red foxes, and others.

Both of these Screen Tour films are Karl Maslowski's own work and should be excellent. The matinee Screen Tour was planned primarily for school children, but the film will please young and older alike—and so will Mr. Maslowski, who proved so engaging two years ago. Matinee tickets for school children will be 25 cents, and can be had at the door on the afternoon of the matinee. All others attending the matinee will be asked to pay evening performance prices (general admission, 74 cents; students, 50 cents). Season tickets can be used at either performance. Both season and single admission tickets can be obtained at the Civic Auditorium Box Office afternoons this week, between 2 and 5 o'clock; and between 7 and 8, Saturday evening.

THE OCTOBER MEETING will be held Monday, October 9, in Los Gatos, at the invitation of the Los Gatos members. The meeting place will be the Legion Memorial Building, 123 East Main St. (across the street from the Town Hall), and the time 8 o'clock. It will be an informal, get-together meeting after the summer vacation. Our new members are especially invited to come and get acquainted. As part of the program we shall have opportunity to tell about our bird observations this summer; so come prepared to share your bird experiences with other enthusiasts. If you have color slides taken this summer or on any of our field trips, bring them along. Agnes Prusman will have charge of the program and will have screen and projector on hand.

THE SECOND FIELD TRIP SCHEDULED FOR OCTOBER will be taken Saturday, October 28 (we were mistaken about there being three field trips in October), to the Los Banos Bird and Game Refuge, with Al Wool as leader. The meeting place for the trip will be Tiny's restaurant in Los Banos on Highway 152, at 8 a.m. If you do not want breakfast in Los Banos, be at Tiny's at 8:30 or at the Refuge entrance at 9 o'clock. Bring lunch and warm wraps (it was sunny and mild last year, but it can be windy and cold). This is the trip to see waterfowl—myriads of them!
