• Look for noisy Jays and Crows in the trees and fields.

• Hawks and Vultures are commonly seen flying overhead or perched on poles or large branches.

• Woodpeckers and Nuthatches are commonly seen on tree trunks and the suet feeder.

• Sparrows scratch and hop on the ground or can be seen on the bird feeders.

• Finches and Pine Siskin enjoy the Nyjer seed in the yellow bird feeder.
